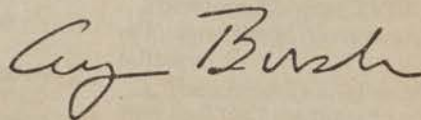
Sale of Stingers to Bahrain

Memorandum for the Secretary of State

By virtue of the authority vested in me by section 614(a)(2) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, as amended, 22 U.S.C. 2364(a)(2), I hereby determine that it is vital to the national security interests of the United States to sell Stinger missiles and associated equipment to the Government of Bahrain, and I hereby authorize such sale, notwithstanding the requirements of section 566 of the Foreign Operations, Export Financing, and Related Programs Appropriations Act, 1989 (Public Law 100-461).

You are directed to report this determination to Congress immediately and to publish it in the **Federal Register**.

7 CFR Parts 1941 and 1943

Removal of Form FmHA 492-19, "Characteristics of Approved Applicants"

AGENCY: Farmers Home Administration, USDA.

ACTION: Final rule.

SUMMARY: The Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) amends its regulation to remove references to Form FmHA 492-19 which has been deemed unnecessary. The intended effect of this section is to update the Agency regulations and CFR.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: This action has been reviewed under Secretary's Memorandum 1512-1 which implements Executive Order 12291 and has been determined to be exempt from those requirements because it involves only internal Agency management. It is the policy of this Department to publish for comment rules relating to public property, loans, grants, benefits, or contract, notwithstanding the exemption in 5 U.S.C. 553 with respect to such rules. However, this action is not published for proposed rulemaking since it involves internal Agency management and publication for comment is unnecessary.

Environmental Impact Statement

This document has been reviewed according to 7 CFR Part 1940, Subpart G "Environmental Program." FmHA has determined that this action does not constitute a major Federal action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment, and in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, Public Law 91-190, an Environmental Impact Statement is not required.

Loan and Grant Programs; Servicing and Collections

AGENCY: Farmers Home Administration, USDA.

ACTION: Final rule.

SUMMARY: The Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) amends its Community Facilities loan and grant servicing regulations. This action is being taken to clarify the regulation. The intended effect is to provide more comprehensive and straightforward guidance to FmHA staff and recipients of assistance relating to the servicing of the affected loans and grants.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: This action has been reviewed under USDA procedures established in Departmental Regulation 1512-1, which implements Executive Order 12291, and has been determined to be "nonmajor" since the annual effect on the economy is less than \$100 million and there will be no significant increase in cost or prices for consumers; individual industries; Federal, State, or Local government agencies; or geographic regions.

Furthermore, there will be no adverse effects on competition, employment, investment, productivity, innovation, or on the ability of United States-based enterprises to compete with foreign-based enterprises in domestic or export markets. This action is not expected to substantially affect budget outlay, to affect more than one agency or to be controversial. The net result is expected to provide better service to rural communities.

These programs/activities are listed in the Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance under Nos. 10.418, Water and Waste Disposal Systems for Rural Communities, and 10.423, Community Facilities Loans, and are subject to the provisions of Executive Order 12372, which requires intergovernmental consultation with State and Local officials. (7 CFR Part 3015, Subpart V, 48 FR 29112, June 24, 1983, and 7 CFR Part 1940, Subpart J, "Intergovernmental Review of Farmers Home Administration Programs and Activities").

This document has been reviewed in accordance with 7 CFR part 1940, Subpart G, "Environmental Programs." It is the determination of FmHA that this action does not constitute a major Federal action significantly affecting the

quality of the human environment and in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, Pub. L. 91-190, an Environmental Impact Statement is not required.

BACKGROUND: This action, which amends Subpart O of part 1951, was published as a proposed rule for public comment on December 19, 1988 (53 FR 50972), giving interested parties until January 18, 1989, to submit comments. No comments were received. Therefore, the Agency adopts the proposed rule as final without changes.

Accordingly, Chapter XVIII, Title 7, Code of Federal Regulations, is amended as follows:

PART 1951—SERVICING AND COLLECTIONS

1. The authority citation for Part 1951 continues to read as follows:

Authority: 7 U.S.C. 1989; 42 U.S.C. 1480; 5 U.S.C. 301; 7 CFR 2.23; 7 CFR 2.70.

Subpart O—Servicing Cases Where Unauthorized Loan(s) or Other Financial Assistance Was Received—Community and Insured Business Programs

2. Section 1951.711 is amended by revising paragraph (b)(3) to read as follows:

§ 1951.711 Servicing options in lieu of liquidation or legal action to collect.

* * * * *

(b) * * *

(3) *Unauthorized subsidy benefits received.* When the recipient was eligible for the loan but should have been charged a higher interest rate than that in the debt instrument, which resulted in the receipt of unauthorized subsidy benefits, the case will be handled as outlined in this paragraph. The recipient will be given the option to submit a written request that the interest rate be adjusted to the lower of the rate for which they were eligible that was in effect at the date of loan approval or loan closing. (See Exhibit C of this subpart for interest rates (available in any FmHA office)). FmHA servicing officials will make a concerted effort to collect all unauthorized subsidy benefits from the recipient and will contact the Office of General Counsel in each case for advice in accomplishing corrective actions.

7 CFR Part 1951

Servicing and Collections

AGENCY: Farmers Home Administration, USDA.

ACTION: Final rule.

SUMMARY: The Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) is revising its Single Family Housing servicing and collections regulation to change the number and title of Form FmHA 451-37 "Additional Partial Payment Agreement," to Form FmHA 1951-37, "Additional Payment Agreement." Changes are also being made in the regulation to correspond with the change of the number and title of this form. The intended effect of this action is to update, revise, and streamline the processing of the additional payment agreement consistent with program and borrower needs.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: This final action has been reviewed under USDA procedures established in Departmental Regulation 1512-1 which implements Executive Order 12291, and has been determined to be exempt from those requirements because it involves only internal agency management. It is the policy of this Department to publish for comment rules relating to public property, loans, grants, benefits, or contracts, notwithstanding the exemption in 5 U.S.C. 533 with respect to such rules. This action, however, is not published for proposed rulemaking since it involves only corrections, clarifications or matters involving management, making publication for comment unnecessary and impractical.
